Cookies Policy

What are Cookies?

Cookies are text files with small pieces of data that are stored by your browser when you access websites on your computer or mobile phone. Cookies are used to record how you navigate the Website during each visit as well as make the websites work more efficiently and provide information to the owners of the site.

What are Cookies used for?

Information from cookies are statistical data, which means they do not identify you personally. We may use cookies where appropriate to gather information about your computer to assist us in improving our website.

A visit to our website may generate the following types of cookies:

1. Session cookies

Session cookies are short-lasting cookies that expire at the end of your browser session or when you log off. Session cookies are not tracking cookies. They are stored only temporarily and destroyed upon leaving the page. They help ensure the website works efficiently to provide a seamless user experience.

2. Persistent cookies

Persistent cookies are stored on your device in between browser sessions to help remember preferences, user settings, information or login credentials you previously saved. Despite the name, persistent cookies have an expiration date set by the webserver after which the cookie is destroyed. Persistent cookies allow us to remember your preferences or actions across multiple sites. This helps us analyse visitor preferences and allows us to improve the user experience.

3. First-party cookies

First-party cookies are directly stored by our website when you visit our website in order to preserve your settings. They allow us to collect analytics data, remember language settings, checkout cart functions and sign-in credentials – important things that help create a seamless user experience. First-party cookies are limited to a specific website. We cannot use first-party cookies to track your activity outside of our website.

4. Third-party cookies

Third-party cookies are placed in your browser by a website, or domain, that is not the website or domain that you are currently visiting.

Is my information safe?

Yes. Cookies don't allow us to access any personal information about you. We only collect the data into statistical results in order to evaluate and improve our website.

Can I disable Cookies?
